





Owing to this, it can be used to improve the texture of the soil damaged by overgrazing and poor agricultural techniques. Furthermore, it has a complex root network. This is ideal for preventing soil erosion and flooding.

Another major highlight is that bamboo produces 35% more oxygen than other trees. Research has shown that bamboo can absorb as much as 12 tonnes of carbon dioxide per hectare per year. So, this plant can play a great role in strengthening my country's ecosystem.

At last, I can say that amongst all **plants**, **vegetables** or **crops** that you I'm familiar with, Bonsai Bamboo is my favourite.



It did not taste sweet at all!


